2021 Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program

Eligible seniors receive ten \$5 coupons to use at participating farmers' markets and roadside stands.

The Department of Aging partners with area agencies on aging to offer the Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program in 81 counties. Participants receive benefits to be redeemed for Ohio-grown fresh vegetables, fruits, herbs, and honey. Some restrictions apply.

You are eligible for the Ohio Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program if: You are age 60 or older,

You live in one of the 81 counties that participate in the program, and You have a household income that falls within certain guidelines.

Individuals in need of transportation to a vaccine appointment in Ashtabula County can call 992-4411 to schedule their ride.

Callers will need to provide their first and last name, their address, and the address of the location where they will be getting vaccinated. They will also need to give the date and time of the appointment.

Tax Deadline Extended



Tax Deadline Extended to May 17th

The Treasury Department and Internal Revenue Service has announced that the federal income tax filing due date for individuals for the 2020 tax year will be automatically extended from April 15, 2021, to May 17, 2021.

Taxpayers can also delay payment of any money owed the IRS until May 17. If clients still need more time to submit their returns, they can request an extension until Oct. 15.



Mass Vaccination Clinic Updates

Starting April 6th to the 26th the Wolstein Center will be transitioning to providing the second Pfizer dose for those who received there first dose there in the previous weeks.

The Clinic will be available to everyone again starting on April 27th and continuing until May 10th. At that time the clinic is planning to provide the one shot Johnson and Johnson Vaccine.

Vaccine eligible Ohioans can sign up for the Wolstein Center at gettheshot.coronavirus.ohio.gov. Enter the ZIP code 44115 in the zip code search field. If the Wolstein Center site does not appear in the search results, no appointments are available. Slots open regularly, and you are encouraged to keep checking the site. Appointments can also be

Ashtabula County Health Dept. Opens Vaccine Clinics

The Ashtabula County Health Department is no longer registering people for the Covid-19 vaccine. Instead, they are now holding open clinics and closed clinics.

Open clinics are clinics where anyone who qualifies for the vaccine can show up to receive a dose, though those 50 and older or with serious underlying health concerns will be prioritized. Many of these clinics will be open from 9:00 am—2:30 pm. Individuals will be asked to arrive at the time set aside for their last name. For example, John Smith would arrive at 1:30 to receive his vaccine.

Closed clinics are by appointment only. Those appointments are for individuals contacted by the Ashtabula County Health Department. No walk-ins. Please look at the above chart for clinic times or go to ashtabulacountyhealth.com

COVID-19 Vaccine Expanded Eligibility

Governor DeWine has expanded the eligibility for the Covid-19 vaccine. As of March, 29th 2021 people 16 and older are able to sign up for the vaccine.

The governor also added some health conditions to the list of people that qualify. The list now includes people with cancer, chronic kidney disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, heart disease, and obesity.

There is now a state website where you can find your local vaccine providers and even register with some of them. http://gettheshot.coronavirus.ohio.gov/.

Locations you can register for the vaccine are as follows:
